## Extended Registration

The last day to register using the online system is **March 24, 2011**. Please mark your calendars and be sure to register by this date. Afterwards, registration can only be performed on-site at the Congress and fees for both members and non-members will increase by US \$100.

#### Accommodation

To assist those of you who have waited until recently to register, the deadline for online hotel reservations was extended from Dec. 31, 2010 to March 30, 2011. This is the absolute latest date by which you will be able to take advantage of the special rates and room blocks set aside exclusively for WCD participants. Hotel rooms will be in extremely high demand in May, which is the height of the "Festival Season" in Seoul, so we encourage you to make your reservation as early as possible to avoid disappointment. ### L'Oreal Award

# **GENERAL CONGRESS INFORMATION**

#### Visa Information

All foreign visitors must possess a valid passport in order to enter the Republic of Korea. Visitors from many countries are eligible for temporary visa-free travel to Korea. A full list of these countries may be found on the congress website at www.wcd2011.org. If you require an invitation letter to obtain a visa (check with your local Korean consulate for invitation letter requirements), please complete the letter request form, which can be downloaded from the 'registration' section of the congress website, and submit to registration@wcd2011.org. Invitation letters are only provided to fully registered congress delegates.

## · Getting to your hotel from Incheon International Airport

There are three convenient means of reaching your hotel from Incheon International Airport: limousine bus, express rail and taxi. Limousine buses operate between 05:35 and 21:00 to all major hotels in Seoul and charge fares ranging from 8,000 – 14,000 KRW, depending on the number of stops. More information and tickets are available at the Transportation Information Counters (near exits 2, 4, 9 and 13) on the arrival floor (1st floor) of the passenger terminal. Visitors can also travel from Incheon Airport to downtown Seoul using the Airport Railroad Express (AREX). The trip lasts just under 45 minutes, faster than both bus and taxi, with fares at approximately 3,200 KRW. Taxis are also available around the clock for transportation from the airport to any destination in Seoul. Patrons may request a flat fare of 60,000 KRW with an additional latenight charge added for trips between midnight and 4 a.m.

## Notices for E-posters and Free Communications

Hundreds of oral presentations have been organized into 41 separate free communication sessions. Over 2,800 E-posters will also be displayed, so we ask that all E-poster presentation materials be submitted through the online system no later than **March 30, 2011**. If your E-poster materials are not uploaded by this date, it will not be considered for any awards and your abstract may be retracted.

## E-poster Awards

The thirty E-poster presentations which demonstrate the highest levels of excellence and innovation will be recognized by the WCD2011 Organizing Committee through awards and grants totaling \$11,000. Members of

the Scientific Committee and experts of the 42 poster topics will evaluate each poster and determine the winners which will be divided into the following three categories:

Gold: \$500 (10 recipients) Silver: \$350 (10 recipients) Bronze: \$250 (10 recipients)

E-posters which are not submitted through the online system by March 31, 2011 will not be considered for awards.

### Invited Speakers: Final Request for Abstract Submissions

Organization of the official scientific program, involving nearly 1,200 chairpersons and speakers, is nearing full completion. Therefore, we urgently request that invited speakers who have not yet submitted abstracts for their presentations do so no later than **March 12**, **2011**. 
